My dear Friends,

We are now coming to one of our busiest and most important months of the year. But, above all commend all our work in your prayers—especially remember our Confirmation Candidates and beware! The harder you work and we work together so much harder will Satan try to get between us. He is working hard—his present tactics, trying to make us exaggerate mole hills of trouble into mountains. Defence against that-remember, "Every thought of holiness" comes from the Holy Spirit within you and every nasty thought about yourself or someone else is put there by Satan. After all if you do think some one is a "wrong 'un" and trying to do you down, two wrongs won't make a right. All the time we spend on Satan-inspired thoughts is time spent for Satan.
