My dear Friends,

We are now coming to one of our busiest and most important months of the year. It is important because all work from now until Easter largely depends on our willingness to commit ourselves to our various undertakings. First comes the formation of our Confirmation Classes and this concerns most of us, for we are all missionaries in this matter. No one is too old for Confirmation and many of us know and have friends who have hesitated to come forward in the past and who, deep down, still have a suppressed wish that they had been Confirmed in their youth. Two such have come forward this week. There are many others and all of us must realize our duty in this matter. The Spirit of God is moving strongly all over England and we must all help each other to get "in tune with the Infinite." How can we help those parents who say they do not want their children Confirmed because "he wouldn't live up to it?"

I shall try to preach about this on October 10th at the evening service. The previous Sunday is our Harvest Thanksgiving and, unless there is an alteration Summer Time ends that morning and we shall be able to settle down to regular Church going in the dark evenings. In that there is work for every individual. Invite your friends and then bring them; come with them and, if strangers to us, please see that they are introduced to me or the Church Wardens.

On October 31st—the Eve of All Saints—we shall have the Deaf and Dumb of the Diocese with us, and the Sermon and Service will be interpreted to them. We shall be glad to have them with us. At this Service there will be a retiring collection for the Mission to the Deaf and Dumb.

You will see by the Calendar that the month is busy enough for all of us.

We held a very good meeting of Bazaar helpers this week and when you hear that there are, at least, fifteen stalls, you will realize that it will be a good time to collect Christmas presents and also that

it is very unlikely that there is no stall to which you could not contribute. Sixpenny Thrift Tickets are obtainable from all helpers. They are well worth having. Please find out which of your neighbours has them and arrange to buy one or two each week until The Day, 26th November. And don't forget it is an "intensive" bazaar—no time for long sit-down chats. The Bazaar opens at 6 p.m. (I think, but you can confirm this), and we have a Pie Supper immediately afterwards.

This month we have a Family Party and Pie Supper in connection with our Patronal Festival on Friday, 22nd October, and a Hallowe'en Family Party on the following Friday (but no Pie Supper on this occasion).

There are lots of other activities in October, so note the Calendar and the Notices in the Church Porch.

But, above all commend all our work in your prayers—especially remember our Confirmation Candidates and beware! The harder you work and we work together so much harder will Satan try to get between us. He is working hard—his present tactics, trying to make us exaggerate mole hills of trouble into mountains. Defence against that—remember, "Every thought of holiness" comes from the Holy Spirit within you and every nasty thought about yourself or someone else is put there by Satan. After all if you do think some one is a "wrong 'un" and trying to do you down, two wrongs won't make a right. All the time we spend on Satan—inspired thoughts is time spent for Satan. "Who is on the Lord's side?" Satan isn't a God. There is only one God and He reigns!
