

St. Edward's Vicarage, Park Road, Barnsley.

My Dear Parishioner,

In a few days the parish of St. Edward will be without a Vicar. The Bishop of Wakefield has assured me that he sees no reason as Patron of the Living why the inter-regnum should be of long duration. I myself hope very much that the name of my successor will be known even before I leave the parish. But to dispel rumours which I suppose always circulate at such a time as this I must tell you that at the present moment no person has actually been offered the Living of St. Edward, so that it follows that no-one has accepted the Living and matters are not all cut and dried. People who pass on such gossipy bits of news do no good service to the Church, and I would ask you to take no notice of them. I assure you that in these matters as soon as the Living has been both offered and accepted the news will be published to you without delay. So please squash rumour, and have no part in passing it on.

There is bound to be at least a month's period of inter-regnum between the leaving of one incumbent and the induction of another. And this is surely wise. Personally I should be very surprised if the induction took place in August, and I think you would be wise to think rather in terms of September or October when the life of the parish will be starting up again after the inevitable lull of the holiday period.

Any worthwhile fruits of my own ministry will of course become apparent only in the months and years ahead. I do feel that there are very many people in the parish who will look upon the period of the inter-regnum as a period of challenge. I ask you to preserve and strengthen whatever is good and worthwhile in our Church life, and to take especial care about the Parish Communion. Fortunately through the kindness of my brother clergy every Sunday at 9.30 in July and August is being taken care of with the exception of one—and I think that this too will be managed. These days almost every parish has a service at about that time, which does create problems. So do hold fast to that service until the time of the induction by your active participation, and throughout the coming weeks make the brotherhood and fellowship of the Church very real.

To all of you, office-holders and all other active members of St. Edward's, I should like to say "Thank you for all that you have done in the service of the Church of God during my time among you as Vicar, and to my successor, whoever he may be, do give your whole-hearted support and co-operation. Remember no Church must want to stand still, far less look backwards too much over its shoulder. Go forward into new paths willingly and readily.

Expect your Vicar to lead you into new and unsuspected insights. Let St. Edward's be a place where one's Christianity is warm, spontaneous and sincere. And above all, love the brotherhood and honour each other as God loves and honours you without the tedious, and unfruitful business of weighing up merit.

It has been a great privilege to have been your Vicar during these years, and I thank God for all the ways in which He has used us in His service.

To those readers of this magazine who are not as yet regularly in their place to worship God within this fellowship Sunday by Sunday I would like to leave a special word. The Church is grateful for your goodwill and your interest. Only seek and you will surely find. God will give you far more than you can ever give Him. Go forward step by step, a little way at a time. To be on the right road, travelling slowly, is better by far than rushing enthusiastically down blind alleys.
